Business Leaders and Education Advocates Call for Renewed Focus on Student Achievement

The Greater Raleigh Chamber of Commerce and Wake Education Partnership are calling for a renewed focus on student achievement in Wake County. The Chamber and Partnership are asking the Wake County Boards of Education and Commissioners for an opportunity to meet with them to propose the development of an interlocal agreement between the Board of Education and the Board of Commissioners.

"Over the years, the Wake County Board of Education and the Wake County Board of Commissioners have exhibited strong leadership and a willingness to work together to build one of the most successful public school systems in America," said Harvey Schmitt, president and CEO of the Greater Raleigh Chamber of Commerce.
