A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Over the past three years we have faced extraordinary challenges as a nation and as a global community. The pandemic, along with various other divisive issues, has tested our resolve and resilience. I am immensely proud of how our WakeEd team, Board, and Leadership Council have risen to these challenges and embraced innovative ways to work. Together, we have created and expanded numerous programs aimed at providing the 160,000 students in Wake County Public Schools with the world-class education they truly deserve.

While we recognize that the challenges of the past three years may persist, it is equally clear that our dedication to our public schools, our energy, and our passion for finding solutions will continue undeterred. Together, we have much to celebrate for this past 2022-2023 year:

Thriving New Initiatives: The successful implementation of new initiatives-Tools4Schools, Career Accelerator, and Career Exploration, have directly benefited our teachers and students. Tools4Schools went from serving 741 teachers in our first six months to 3,637 this past school year giving away more than \$340,000 in new classroom supplies. Our direct student engagement through new career pathways programs have opened life-changing opportunities for students while forging stronger ties between WakeEd and the business community.

Expanding Existing Programs: Our existing programs, like Partners Read and SummerSTEM, continue to attract new partners and positively impact the lives of students and teachers. This past school year more than 300 WakeEd Partners Read volunteers read with struggling first grade students every week in 60 Wake County elementary schools, surpassing the 57 schools served pre-COVID.

Return to In-Person Events: This past year WakeEd successfully hosted fully in-person events, including the Stars of Education Gala, SummerSTEM, STEMposium, and Partners Read year-end celebration. As we prepare for the upcoming Stars of Education Gala in October 2023, we celebrate our 40th anniversary, adding a new teacher recognition and a student Emerging Star Award and scholarship.

Growing Support: Our progress and achievements would not have been possible without the unwavering support of companies, foundations, individuals, local government, and community partners. Thanks to this support, our financial health has significantly improved, with total giving reaching \$1 million this fiscal year, up from \$537,000 in 2020.

Looking ahead, there are new challenges, including changing leadership at Wake County Public Schools and deeply concerning budgets and legislation from the NC General Assembly that do not prioritize our public school teachers or students.

Together, we have proven our dedication to public schools and the value that WakeEd brings to the community. Let us continue to stand unified in our mission and unwavering belief in the transformative power of public education.

WakeEd's SummerSTEM is a program that enriches educators' understanding of the skills and knowledge necessary to succeed in the workplace using Project-Based Learning (PBL) with an emphasis on STEM businesses and careers. In addition to direct instruction and coaching in lesson design, K-12 educators participate in immersive experiences with local companies, exploring targeted career fields they can take back to the classroom. This nationally recognized, award-winning program reaches 100 teachers each year.

Career Accelerator WakeEd PARTNERSHIP

Career Accelerator is a workforce development program launched in 2022 created to provide high school students in rising 10th through 12th grades with immersive experiences with local companies, exploring a variety of career fields. This free summer program is hosted at local high schools across Wake County. All WCPSS rising 10th through12th grade students are invited to participate. In addition to immersion experiences, students will receive coaching and instruction in other workforce development areas, such as CV building, social media use, and interviewing skills. Students will receive a monetary stipend upon completion of key program elements, including industry certificates and/or credentials.

CAREER EXPLORATION PILOT

Career Exploration is a new workforce development program launching in 2023, providing middle school students in 7th grade with short burst immersive experiences throughout the school year to explore career opportunities in a multitude of career fields. Students are provided: short on-site immersions with a local company, post-immersion Q&A luncheons at school with company employees, a personality-based test or career inventory to help students identify their strengths and how to use them in their future careers, and guidance from their school's Career Development Coordinator to map out their career paths.

WakeEd Partnership's Partners Read program places community volunteers into Wake County elementary schools to read with developing first grade readers. Volunteers have the unique opportunity to develop one-on-one relationships with students through Partners Read, as they help them increase confidence and enjoyment in reading. 
